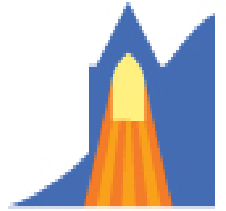

A few thoughts on recordings in church.

There are many things about First Presbyterian Church that we all love and enjoy. God has blessed our congregation and guests with many talents and God has blessed us with families and friends that we love and respect.

Therefore it is no surprise that you want to record and document the activities of your friends and family that take place in our church. Our children are, well, just plain cute and fun (usually) and we cherish the memories we will have.

However, we would like you to keep the following thoughts in your mind when you record church activities.

- Our children are valuable to us, to others, and to God. We want to protect them from the big, bad world for as long as possible. Therefore, we ask you to refrain from putting images (photographs, videos, and voices) of children who are not your own on the Internet, social media, Facebook, YouTube, and other places where those who may not have loving feelings for children may view and identify them.
- One of God's many gifts to people are talents of music, acting, composing, writing, etc. People with those skills deserve to make a living with those skills. Recording music performed by our choirs is a violation of the rights of those composers and arrangers to control their own works. Please refrain from recording such performances, except for your own personal use.
- We call the place where we worship a sanctuary. Most (hopefully all) people come to our worship services to worship God in a peaceful, quiet setting. They are literally seeking a sanctuary from the hectic, everyday world in which we live. Please keep that in mind when recording music or other activities in our church.

## From the Pastor

William G. Carter

Dear friends,

The weather experts are predicting a snow day. As desirable as that sounds, I will believe it when I see it. I have lived long enough in this town to know that the prognosticators often don't know what they are talking about. The latest prediction of "Stormzilla" will prompt many to make a run for milk, bread, and Quik Joe. But I will wait to see what actually falls out of the sky.

In my morning reading, I came across the opening words of Psalm 57. They seemed appropriate for today:

*Be merciful to me, O God, be merciful to me, for in you my soul takes refuge;  
In the shadow of your wings I will take refuge, until the destroying storms pass by. (57:1)*

"Destroying storms" were probably not blizzards in ancient Israel. In fact, the rest of the Psalm suggests that the poet is experiencing a lot of interpersonal difficulties: enemies are trampling on him, the crafty are devising traps, and "devouring lions" are licking their chops. It is still true that the presence of adversaries can shake us up, and make it seem like the emotional weather is against us. So the Psalmist turns to God and asks for help:

*I cry to God Most High, to God who fulfills his purpose for me. (57:2)*

It is that prayerful move that provides the most help. Notice that it's not only approaching God, the One who has the Most High power — but approaching God who has a purpose for each one of us, and who fulfills it.

Hmm . . . what is God's purpose for you? Consider this an invitation to reflect on your life and ask the Really Big Question: why am I here?

Some might fear that our lives are random, a chance chemistry experiment, with no purpose unless we create it for ourselves. Others who sense the presence of dangerous "storms" and threatening "lions" may question if there actually is a heavenly map for our lives, especially if they are worried about their survival. I choose another alternative: to trust that God made me, fashioned me with interests and talents, and invites me to answer a continuing call to serve God and neighbor with all that I have received. These are the clues to my purpose — and the clues for discovering your own.

Here is how writer Frederick Buechner once said it: "Listen to your life. See it for the fathomless mystery it is. In the boredom and pain of it, no less than in the excitement and gladness: touch, taste, smell your way to the holy and hidden heart of it, because in the last analysis all moments are key moments, and life itself is grace." (*Now and Then*)

Meanwhile the threat of heavy snow continues, and I trust my Life's Purpose is more than shoveling it. So I will do what I can to remove the snow from my driveway, make a pot of soup, and consider how God loves us all so much as to invite us to make the most of the time we have and the relationships we have received.

**Spark (Newborn - 3 year old)** enjoy Bible stories, songs and games in the nursery with teachers Laura Schillinger and our Sunday caregivers. February's lessons take a look at The Calling Disciples (Luke 5:1-11; 8:1-3), Four Friends, (Luke 5:17-26), and The Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37)

**Power Xpress (4 year old - Grade 5)** For the months of January and February, children will experience Bible stories in one classroom. February 4 and 11: The Man Beside the Pool (John 5:1-15). God healed a paralyzed man and provided this man with hope. God is a source of hope and healing in our lives as well. February 18: Ash Wednesday Program. February 25: Surprise Week. Curious about what we're doing this evening? Come and find out!

**We Believe: The Story of God's Faithfulness (Grades 6-8)** Room 209 with Jana Schillinger and Dick Cochrane. Using We Believe: The Story of God's Faithfulness, our Middle School Class will spend the year digging deeper into the Old Testament, learning and experiencing how God revealed himself to the Hebrew people. February takes us into the stories of King David (1 Samuel 15:16-16:13; 17:1-49; 19:8-17), King Solomon (1 Chronicles 22:2-19; 1 Kings 1:15-31; 3:3-15; 4:20-34) and the Psalms (Psalm 44; 116; 117).

**PresbyYouth (Grades 9-12; college age adults)** Room 111 with Jack Pittman and Darlene Scappatura. PresbyYouth's Nativity, Water and Wilderness unit encourages students to observe "rites of passage" events in the life of Jesus and to make connections with faith milestones in their own lives. This unit finishes by learning about The Daily Life of a Nomad (Genesis 18:1-12; Exodus 16:1-31; 17:1-7), The Tent of Meeting (Exodus 25:1-9; 33:7-11; Mark 9:2-8; Hebrews 8:1-13; 9:11-14) and the Wilderness Journeys (Exodus 13:17-22; 15:22-27; 16:2-3; 17:1-7; 19:1-9; Psalm 23)

**Talking About God Stuff (T.A.G.S.)** Room 206. February 4 and 11: *The Truth About David*. David is a towering figure in the Jewish scriptures. The greatest of Israel's kings, he is a complex person of extraordinary power and deep vulnerability. We will explore four different perspectives that the Bible has on David: the hero, the sinner, the political symbol, the hope for the future. On **Ash Wednesday, February 18**, all adults will be in one class looking at the "Disciplines of the Spirit" with Rev. Carter. Come and begin the Lenten journey!

**Faith and Life** Room 210. February 4-February 11: *Cultivating Faith in Children*. It's back! So many of you have been asking for our parenting class to return, so here it is! This year, the conversation continues by providing you with some resources about how to cultivate faith in your children and create a faith-based home. 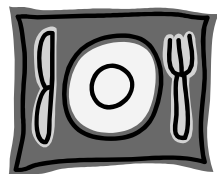

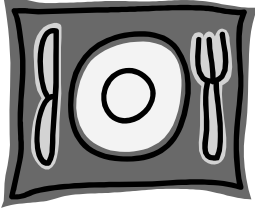

Book Group: February 26th at 7:00 will find us at Nancy Owens' home for a discussion of The Orphan Train by Deckle Edge. A long journey from home and the struggle to find it again form the heart of the intertwined stories that make up this moving novel. Foster teen Molly is performing community-service work for elderly widow Vivian, and as they go through Vivian's cluttered attic, they discover that their lives have much in common. When Vivian was a girl, she was taken to a new life on an orphan train. These trains carried children to adoptive families for 75 years, from the mid-nineteenth century to the start of the Great Depression. Novelist Kline (Bird in Hand, 2009) brings Vivian's hardscrabble existence in Depression-era Minnesota to stunning life. Molly's present-day story in Maine seems to pale in comparison, but as we listen to the two characters talk, we find grace and power in both of these seemingly disparate lives. Although the girls are vulnerable, left to the whims of strangers, they show courage and

resourcefulness. Kline illuminates a largely hidden chapter of American history, while portraying the coming-of-age of two resilient young women.

## STEPHEN MINISTRY



Stephen Ministry: Stephen Ministry does more than help the care receiver, the Stephen Ministers gain so much about learning to listen, pray, and let God into their lives. Here is what one Stephen Minister says about her journey.

One of the things we learned during Stephen Minister training was how and when to pray with our care receivers. Improvised praying (as I call it) made me very nervous at first—even though I do improvisational acting! But I've found that when I do pray with a care receiver, I can feel God saying to me "Relax!" and the words just seem to flow. I never thought I could pray aloud like this, but now I feel very comfortable doing it. A byproduct of being a Stephen Minister is that my faith has deepened. I talk to God all the time and constantly see Him at work in my life.

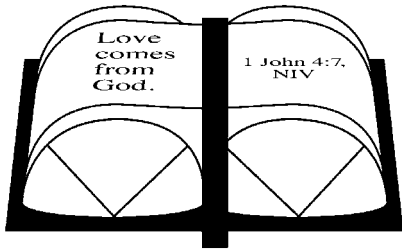
### 2015 Flower Calendar

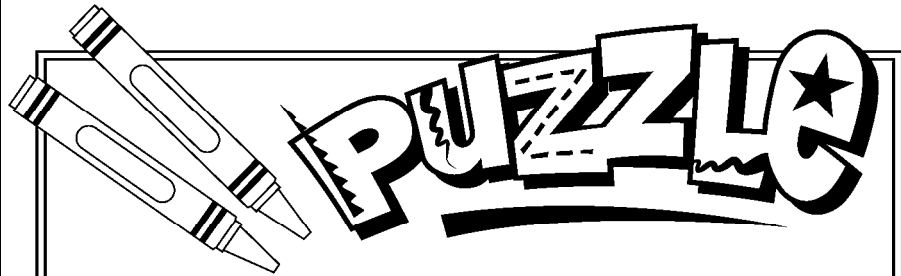


**What you need:**

**What you do:**

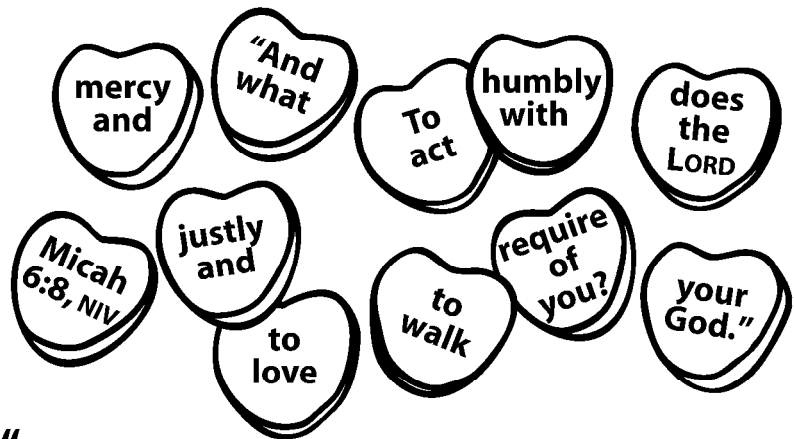
1. In the center of the black paper, tape down the candy bars side by side.

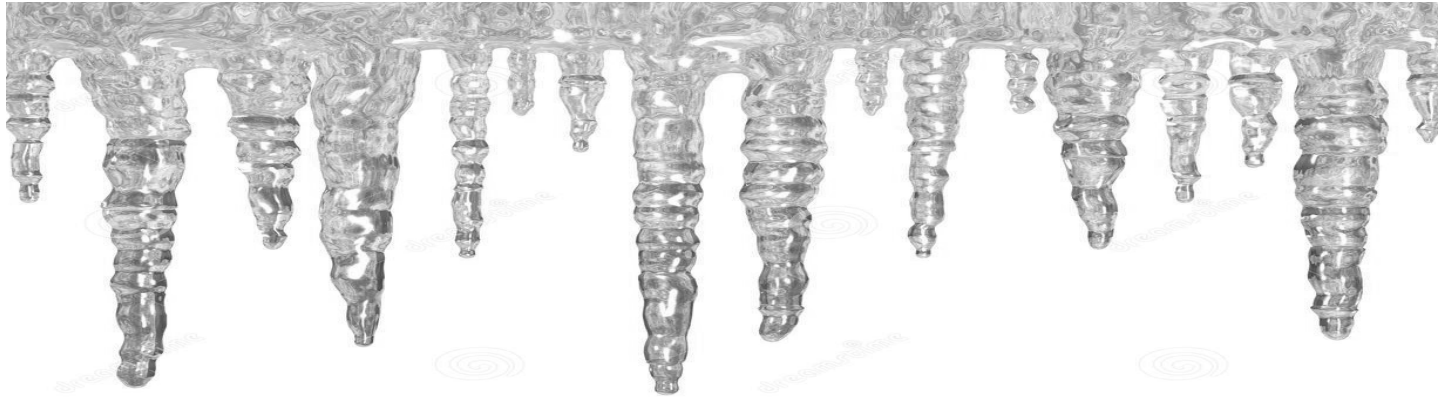

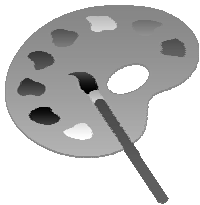


### Ice Festival Activities- February 13-15

## Mission and Justice Committee News

Ever wonder what happened with the money we committed to Haiti for our Centennial Campaign? Wonder no more. Read about the amazing things that were accomplished through micro financing in Haiti with the money we gave to Groundswell International. Steve Brescia, Director, sent us a final report detailing the development of savings and credit cooperatives in rural Haiti. The lives of 343 women have been changed by involvement in these cooperatives, which have allowed them to better support their families. Excerpts of Groundswell's report are below. You can find the complete report in the Annual Report handed out at the Annual Meeting on Feb. 1, or if you aren't attending the meeting, copies will be placed in the Narthex. You will also find the report on our website. Please read and enjoy the report, and know that our support was truly appreciated and has helped the lives of so many in need.



### FINAL REPORT TO THE FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

#### Communities Generating Prosperity and Sustainable Development in Rural Haiti

The support Groundswell and PDL received from the First Presbyterian Church of Clarks Summit allowed us to provide training and seed capital for loans to emerging savings and credit (S&C) cooperatives in Haiti. The affordable credit provided by these community-managed S&C groups is a key ingredient in generating greater prosperity and wellbeing in rural Haiti.

By the time of our August 2014 report, the Church's generosity had enabled Groundswell and PDL to develop S&C cooperatives that benefitted 260 women in three communal sections, l'Attalaye (100 women), Lalomas (83 women), and Lacedras (77 women), in the Saint Michel region of the Artibonite Department.

We are happy to inform you that since our last report, the S&C groups started with your support are still going strong, and a new S&C group was created in the community of Camathe. As of November 30, 2014, a total of 343 women had benefitted from loans made possible by First Presbyterian Church of Clarks Summit.

It is also worth noting that a total of 841 women are now benefitting from S&C groups in L'Attalaye, Lalomas, Lacedras, and Camathe. More than 40% (343) of these women were able to receive loans thanks to the Church, and the rest we reached with support from other donors.

Women who receive loans typically invest in their farms or other income generating activities and/or in the health and education of their children. For example, during the last loan cycle, Antiola Dorvil used the 2,500 Haitian Gourdes (about \$54) she received from the L'Attalaye S&C group to start a small business selling cloths to people in nearby villages. Antiola uses the money she makes to buy food for her six children and to pay the tuition of one child attending the technical agricultural school in Hinche.

Antiola is just one of the 343 women whose lives you have changed. In a very real way you are helping Groundswell and PDL generate lasting economic development in Haiti's rural areas, which is vital to the realization of our 10-year vision of a prosperous and sustainable Haitian countryside as the foundation for national development.

We truly appreciate the First Presbyterian Church's generosity. Thank you and Merry Christmas!
