Easter Day

He had died on Friday, a painful, cruel death, and those who loved Him had buried Him out of sight. Sunday morning, before sunrise, they went to the grave but found it open. Their Friend was gone. While they wondered, He suddenly stood before them, alive and well, and reminded them that He had told them before that death is only a path to His Father's House, where there are rooms prepared for all His friends.

Some day we shall slip away from these rented tenements, out of repair and tumbling down, the pillars and foundations trembling, the windows dim, the chimneys clogged, the framework giving way, into a beautiful palace where we may grow and learn, and serve and rest. How do we know? Because our Friend died and came back to tell us; not as a ghost, for then He would have been invisible to human eyes which cannot see spirit, but with the glorified body which we, too, are to have.

Since that Easter morning we know that death is not a sleep and a forgetting. It is not going out into the dark. It is not crossing a deep, dangerous river, nor a valley beset by demonds. It is not an awful, gloomy, fearsome thing at all. It is just stepping from the old house into the new, where we may be at first very much as we were here, for the here-after may not be so very different from the here now. But there will be a change and a chance for the poor and sick and crippled, the hard-working, tired, discouraged, disapointed people, and for all who have done wrong and are sorry.

We need not wait for death to reveal this One who conquered death for us. We may know and love Him now, and when our lease ends here, we may be sure of the new home and shall meet at the door not a stranger, nor a judge, nor a shining angel, but our Friend.
