Kolander Creation Call to Worship: Genesis 1:1-5 In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void, and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light, And God saw that the light was good, and God separated the light from the darkness.
