Third Lesson: Ephesians 1:3-14

General Assembly Commissioners for 2022

Lackawanna Presbytery is seeking applicants for one Teaching Elder Commissioner, one Ruling Elder Commissioner, and one Young Adult Advisory Delegate to the 225th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) in 2022. We seek faithful Presbyterians who wish to contribute to the building of God's kingdom by participating in our denomination's highest council.

The General Assembly meets biennially in even-numbered years and consists of commissioners and advisory delegates elected by each of its presbyteries. The GA acts on hundreds of items of business received through reports and recommendations of various assembly entities, and through overtures from synods and presbyteries. Because of the global pandemic, the 2020 Assembly was accomplished virtually via Zoom. In 2022, the Assembly will be a blend of in-person committee meetings held in Louisville and online plenary meetings convened via Zoom. Specific time commitments are described here:
