Today's postlude is based on an 11th century chant. The translation found in English hymnals is "Christians, to the Paschal Victim Offer your thankful praises! A Lamb the sheep redeemeth: Christ, who only is sinless, Reconcileth sinners to the Father; Death and life have contended In that combat stupendous: The Prince of Life, who died, reigns immortal." The tune is based on the Dorian mode rather than the major and minor keys we are accustomed to hearing. It is one of the few ancient sequences (hymns) that are still in use today. Denis Bedard (b. 1950), who wrote this arrangement, is a Canadian organist composer.
