The work tells the perhaps forgotten story of the 1988 hate-crime murder (25 years ago now) of a gay college student in Wyoming, an "ordinary boy" who "never could imagine his life could be this story" yet became a modern-day martyr with federal hate-crime legislation named for him. The large scale production is based on spiritual texts, Shepard's journal, and news reports. This beautiful piece is haunting and truthful. Join us for a soul-stirring evening, unlike any other!
