# From the Pastor

William G. Carter

We look forward to welcoming the Rev. Leith and Carol Fujii to Clarks Summit on Sunday, July 26. Leith and Carol have served as Presbyterian mission workers in Thalland. Our congregation has supported them for many years, and we are thrilled that we will be with us for worship and a presentation following.

In a country where fewer than 1 percent of the people are Christian, the Fujiis embody a respectful witness that flows from walking in relationship with Jesus Christ. For example, Leith has developed a friendship with his barber, Noot, a devout Buddhist. They have had many conversations over the years and one day she asked Leith for a Bible and Christian literature. "She is not the only neighbor who is wondering about our Lord," Leith says.

The Fujiis and their colleagues at the Bangkok Institute of Theology (BIT) are equipping students to present the good news that can satisfy such spiritual curiosity.

A compassionate and compelling witness to Christ's love is needed nowhere more than in Bangkok's notorious red-light district. Every day three BIT alumnae work to help free women from lives of prostitution. They develop friendships with the women, listen to their stories and eventually introduce them to Christ as they demonstrate God's love for them.



The women reached by these BIT alumnae and their co-workers have the opportunity to learn job skills such as jewelry design, card-making, tailoring and business management/accounting. Some of them with only an elementary-level education have been able to study toward and complete their high school equivalency. Carol has been a friend and confidante to the former BIT students and the women they are serving.

Plan on being with us for the day of their visit. You will be enriched by their Christian witness and gain a sense of Christ's work through the many, many people who serve in the mission field for the Presbyterian Church (USA).

## **Building & Grounds Committee Notes:**

We thank everyone for their cooperation during our mock fire drill on Sunday, June 14. This was a necessary first step in developing an effective emergency evacuation plan. Over the next few months the B&G committee will be formulating a set of safety policies & procedures, which will include schematic diagrams posted on each floor where needed showing nearest and alternate escape exits, as well as locations of fire extinguishers, oxygen tank, and medical supplies.

In addition, a more detailed set of evacuation instructions will be posted on a wall on each floor, distributed on flyers to each member, included in the Presbyter periodically, and posted on our website.

Sunday's drill was purposely announced in advance, and as expected there was a less than urgent response. As a result, the 100% evacuation goal took 2 minutes and 45 seconds - which is dangerously too long. If a real emergency is caused by a gas leak, toxic fire, or other rapidly advancing threat we will need to get everyone out of the building in half that time. We need to work on this and it will be the major focus of future drills.

During our consultation with Clarks Summit Boro fire chief Jake Hoinowski on June 7, he recommended specific improvements and upgrades which the committee is actively exploring.
