Dear Friends,

A few days before the presidential inauguration, a remarkable moment took place that was not widely noticed. Two Presbyterian (USA) ministers met with Mr. Trump for a conversation and a prayer before he began his term.

The Rev. Patrick O'Connor, pastor of the church in Queens where Mr. Trump was baptized, joined the Rev. Scott Black Johnston, pastor of Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church—which is literally across the street from Trump Tower. They spoke openly with the President-elect for about twenty minutes, and then concluded their visit with a prayer.



I shared the prayer in worship on Sunday, January 22, and have had numerous requests for a copy. It's reprinted below, as I am including it as one of my prayers during these days of transition.

It was the apostle Paul who declared, "Pray without ceasing." (1 Thessalonians 5:17). Good advice, and always in season.

A Prayer for the United States of America and the President-Elect

Almighty God, all the people of the earth are yours. We are all your children. Your will is done when governments are rightly administered, liberty is preserved, justice is decreed, dignity is assured, and care is extended to the most vulnerable of your children.

This day, we ask that you would look with favor on President-elect Donald J. Trump. Protect him and keep his family safe. Grant to him equal doses of courage and humility. Guide him as he makes countless decisions. Give him wisdom and mercy. Enable him to find the right words: good words, true words, healing words.

Our country's differences and divisions are vast. Deliver us, loving God, from rancor and cynicism. Forgive our sins. Encourage us to kindness. Teach us to mend the tattered places in this society. Give us hope and holy perspective for the living of these days.

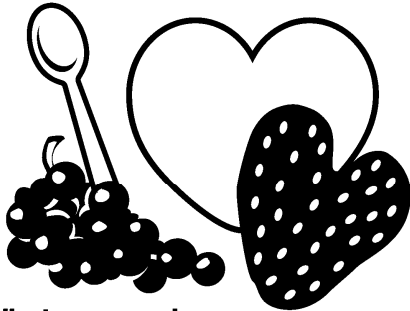
Bethel AME Cold Weather Homeless Shelter.

Heart FRUIT SALAD

Make this cute, healthy snack for your loved ones on Valentine's Day.



What you need:

- Adult help
- Washed fruit (watermelon, cantaloupe, strawberries, grapes)
- Knife and cutting board
- Small heart-shaped cookie cutter
- Bowl and spoon
- Mint leaves (optional)

What you do:


1. Slice the watermelon and use the cookie cutter to make heart shapes.

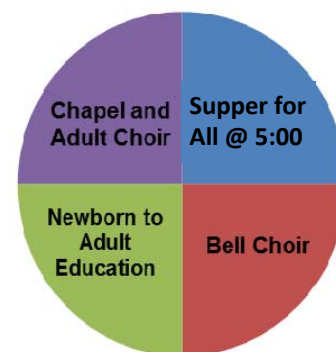
Wednesday, March 1 - Ash Wednesday - classes will be held from 6:15-6:55, followed immediately by worship.

What is the Stephen Ministry? Stephen Ministry is a way congregations can provide high-quality care and outreach to hurting people in the congregation and community. Stephen Ministers are congregation members who have gone through 50 hours of training to provide one-to-one, Christ-centered care. Each Stephen Minister is matched with a hurting person—men are paired with men, women with women—and meets weekly with that person to listen, care, pray, and encourage. Stephen Ministers care for those dealing with grief, divorce, job loss, hospitalization, financial struggles, loneliness, convalescence, terminal illness, and many other life difficulties. February finds us at Nancy London's home on February 23rd at 7:00.

Join us as we discuss **The Nightingale** by Kristin Hannah. In the quiet village of Carriveau, Vianne Mauriac says goodbye to her husband, Antoine, as he heads for the Front. She doesn't believe that the Nazis will invade France ... but invade they do, in droves of marching soldiers, in caravans of trucks and tanks, in planes that fill the skies and drop bombs upon the innocent. When a German captain requisitions Vianne's home, she and her daughter must live with the enemy or lose everything. Without food or money or hope, as danger escalates all around them, she is forced to make one impossible choice after another to keep her family alive. Vianne's sister, Isabelle, is a rebellious eighteen-year-old girl, searching for purpose with all the reckless passion of youth. While thousands of Parisians march into the unknown terrors of war, she meets G etan, a partisan who believes the French can fight the Nazis from within France, and she falls in love as only the young can ... completely. But when he betrays her, Isabelle joins the Resistance and never looks back, risking her life time and again to save others.

With courage, grace and powerful insight, bestselling author Kristin Hannah captures the epic panorama of WWII and illuminates an intimate part of history seldom seen: the women's war. *The Nightingale* tells the stories of two sisters, separated by years and experience, by ideals, passion and circumstance, each embarking on her own dangerous path toward survival, love, and freedom in German-occupied, war-torn France--a heartbreakingly beautiful novel that celebrates the resilience of the human spirit and the durability of women. It is a novel for everyone, a novel for a lifetime.

Baptism



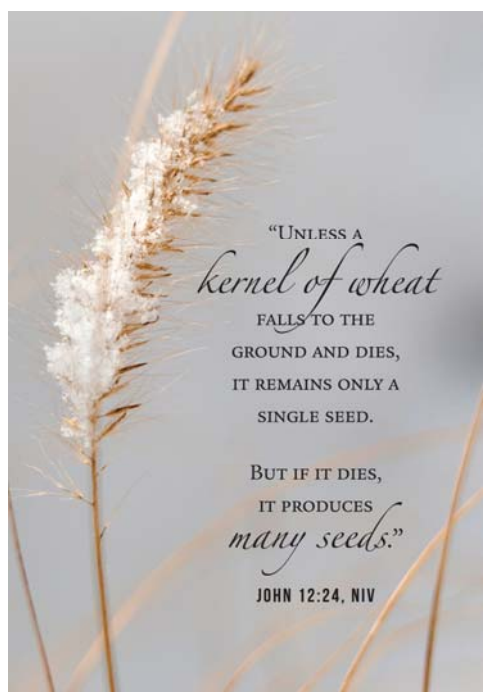
