From the pastor

June 2017

A quick scan of the shelves at the Hallmark store will reveal no Pentecost cards for sale. We celebrate graduations, birthdays, and anniversaries, marking them with expressions of love and congratulations. Easter is portrayed with eggs, bunnies, and bright sunrises. Passover is marked with blessings in Hebrew script. But Pentecost is not for sale.

Pentecost is a day unlike any other. Originating as a festival marking the first fruits of Israel's harvest, the day's meaning shifted as the rural population shifted toward the city. By the time of Jesus, Pentecost became a celebration of God giving the Torah to Israel. It was a festival to the Word of God, given on Mount Sinai in the Ten Commandments and observing the ongoing guidance that God spoke through scripture.

So that's why pious Jews were gathered for the Pentecost holiday that we hear in the second chapter of Acts. They gathered from the various lands where they had been dispersed, expecting a homecoming with their families, celebrative worship, and the excitement that comes with taking part in a large crowd.

What they did not expect - what nobody expected - is that God would break through in some extraordinary ways. Luke describes the first Christian Pentecost in vivid ways:

- "Suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a mighty wind and it filled the entire house where they were sitting..." "Wind" is the same Hebrew word as "Spirit." There was a palpable, real Presence among the people. God was among them.
- "Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them..." This is holy language, recalling the "pillar of fire" that was God's Presence leading the people as they put Egyptian slavery behind them. Now that fire is given freely to each believer. It is no longer a private, guarded possession, but a gift for each one.
- "They began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability..." This dazzling sign had a purpose: to proclaim that Jesus Christ is raised from the dead. The message is clear as the apostle Peter stands to speak. Resurrection is a sign of God's power and an invitation to turn away from the destructive, crucifying forces of evil.

I think I know why Pentecost has never been captured in a greeting card. It's too big, too loud, too explosive. It cannot be reduced to a happy wish or portrayed in a scene from nature. Pentecost is the day when God comes to those who love him, offers the holy Presence among them, and equips us to proclaim that Christ is alive and stronger than the powers of destruction. It's when all the things we have heard about become real for us — and real for the world.

So let's celebrate it in grand style. See you on Pentecost, June 4.



Our Keystone College Education and Peace Scholar, Yaya [Williamson Jacques] will be in Haiti from May 16 to August 24 interning with Partners for Local Development, supervised by Cantave Jean-Baptiste, whom you might recall visited us to update us on the success of the program we supported through Groundswell International and our 2012-2013 capital campaign. Yaya will be trained in community education programming and delivery, which fits very well with his Child and Family Studies education program at Keystone College. He will be getting 3 credits of Education Internship course-work through this activity and has decided to stay on beyond the necessary 120 hours for the internship and also volunteer with PDL for most of the remainder of the summer. The Mission and Justice Committee has allocated funds for his round trip transportation, his annual health insurance, and other incidental costs associated with being a student at Keystone College.
