# From the Pastor Summer 2018

"Summertime, and the livin' is easy..." That's the famous song from "Porgy and Bess," but it doesn't really apply to our church. While we are grateful for a slower pace and longer hours of daylight, there's plenty going on at the Church on the Hill. Let me tell you about some of it.

- 1) Our custom for over a dozen years has been to take some time in early summer to plan the worship services for the next year. Our Worship, Music, and Arts committee has recently met to do this. We begin with a spreadsheet of scripture texts, sermon titles, and themes. Taking note of the calendar dates for the next year (Easter will be on April 21, a bit late, and Christmas is still on December 25), we chart out the possible sermon series (there will be four of them), identify the choir anthems to prepare, and schedule the bell choir. Hymns and psalm settings will be added, and special dates will be added. This advance planning practice gives unity and clarity to our worship services, and keeps us from scrambling week to week.
- 2) In the same way, a planning team has charted our Adult Education offerings for the next program year. Looking primarily for the classes on our WAY program, we know there will classes to dig into scripture (Genesis, 1 and 2 Corinthians, the Beatitudes and the Lord's Prayer, among others), as well as sessions on the visual arts in worship, ways to address racism, the historical martyrs of the church, and (my favorite) "how to tell if the evening news is true." It is going to be an enriching season for all of us, and I'm grateful that we are blessed with wise teachers, eager learners, and helpful planners.
- 3) Dave Porter, our resident art professor, has offered a proposal to bring more color into our sanctuary, which the Session has enthusiastically and unanimously endorsed. As he will share in a table talk at 11:15 a.m. on Sunday, July 22, the "pillars" of the sanctuary (i.e. the spaces between the windows and the wall opposite them) will soon be beautified with original works of art. Please come and be part of this process, by joining us for the table talk.
- 4) Vacation Bible School is on the biblical theme of Babylon. Jana is assembling a team of teachers and helpers to prepare for the children from church and neighborhood who we will welcome during July 16-20. We invite you to be part of this extraordinary annual event. It is and must be a major outreach to the children and families of our community. All year round, a lot happens in our church. There are plenty of things perking: the next year's schedule for the Arts at FPCCS is forming, a Welcome Team of the Deacons is meeting to find ways to reach out to the guests and visitors of our church, another team is meeting with an agency to explore how we can befriend and welcome new immigrants to the region. All this, in addition to our ongoing work of proclaiming the Gospel, praying and studying, and serving those in need.

And one more plug: don't miss **our church's picnic at Camp Lackawanna**, scheduled for Sunday, August 26. Worship will take place at 10:00 a.m., and the picnic following at 11:00 a.m. If you wish to join some of us for a canoe trip at (or around) 12:30 p.m. send a check for \$30 per canoe by Wednesday, August 15. There are eagles on the Susquehanna which are best enjoyed in a casual float down the river.





Make these yummy treats as a summer snack.

#### What you need:

- 1 cup peanut butter
- 1½ oz. instant oats
- ¼ cup honey
- ½ cup instant milk powder
- ½ cup dark chocolate chips
- 40 mini chocolate chips
- 20 slivered almonds
- 40 sliced almonds
- Adult help \( \sigma \)

#### What you do:

- 1. In a bowl, mix peanut butter, oats, honey and instant milk powder into dough. If too dry, add more peanut butter or honey.
- 2. Roll dough into 20 long balls. Place them on a cookie sheet and refrigerate.
- 3. Melt the dark chocolate chips and place them in a zippered baggie. Cut a tiny bit off one corner.
- 4. Remove dough from refrigerator. Squeeze thin lines of chocolate as stripes onto the bee bodies.
- 5. Use two mini chocolate chips for eyes, a slivered almond for a stinger and two sliced almonds as wings. Enjoy!
