- * support for our local community by simply keeping our bills paid, maintaining our staff, and providing on-line worship and faith-based encouragement to meet our spiritual needs.



OK, this is a loaded list. But I am pleased to report that our church folks have repeatedly chosen Letter D. You are an extraordinary community of the faithful. This odd season of our lives has not been wasted. What has been going on? Lots of things:

- The church leaders have kept reaching out to the members of our church family. As one said, "I've made some new friends on the phone, and I can't wait to meet them in person."
- For a series of fifteen Thursday mornings, a group met for weekly Bible study. They want to do more of this, and we will pick this up in the fall in some way.
- The WAY program continued for adults, meeting every Wednesday for a "virtual potluck," eating dinner with one another while discussing matters of faith. We will take a summer break.
- Over thirty households have signed on for a 21 Day Challenge to learn more about racial equity and the ways it has been denied. (Learn more at https://21daychallengefpccs.blogspot.com/)
- Generosity has created more generosity. Not only are our weekly pledges strong, but our Deacons and our Mission and Justice committee have supported programs that feed the hungry.
- We have explored how Christian education of children and youth might be done in new ways. I'm delighted that we will try to do a different kind of Vacation Bible School to reach God's kids.
- While we have been out of the building, our sexton has painted the interior walls. All of them.
- All the while, worship has continued. It's been taking place in a different way, yet we have more people tuning in each week than we normally have sitting in our pews. This is remarkable.


As our building slowly opens up, and people begin to return to our facility, I want to express my deep gratitude for your patience, positive energy, and support. This is a difficult time for all of us. But the restraint is making us stronger. I can see it.

I'm also pleased to share that we are "upping our game" for the weekly worship services. 

Wilderness Escape: VBS at Home 2020

Due to social distancing requirements and restrictions on gatherings, as well as being mindful of the health and safety of our participants and volunteers, this summer our VBS program is **going virtual**.



What will that look like?

A mix of pre-recorded video, live conversations, social interactions, and a box filled with supplies for craft projects and activities to complete at home. (Once registered, families will receive additional information and instructions prior to the start of VBS.)

This year's theme is called **Wilderness Escape**. Our kids will join Moses as he and the Israelites flee Egypt and travel to parts unknown -- trusting God all the while! Moses helped to guide his people through uncertain times in a wild and unknown place. How great it is to trust that God is with us even when things are hard and we face unexpected challenges!
