

Our nursery caregiver is Heather Lyons, a member of this congregation.



# Help us Reach our Capital Campaign Goal!

Our beautiful, but aging, building needed some repairs, appliance replacements, and restoration beyond the scope of our operating budget during the first half of this year. An unexpected sewer line project and necessary external painting, the need for new ovens to provide for opportunities for church fellowship, and increased operating costs have necessitated pulling funds from our reserves. In addition to increased expenses, our investment portfolio has taken a hit along with everyone else's. In total, we are down \$114,000. In the next few years, we anticipate replacing the church's boiler and roof.

With your help, we look to raise \$250,000. Donations can be made one time or over a three-year period. 

#### Afghan Refugees: An Update from Mission and Justice

The Mission & Justice Committee recently purchased hours of a translation service to help a young Afghan couple apply for asylum to stay in the United States. Asylum seekers must apply for asylum within one year of arriving in the United States, and many Afghan families like this one arrived in August 2021. This means their deadline to apply for permanent residency is quickly approaching. In the best of times, local immigration resettlement services could assist them with this application, but until recently, they were closed. They have now reopened, but their accreditation to process such immigration paperwork has lagged.

So, our new neighbors are running out of time to extend their stay, and unfortunately, it is not safe for them to go back to Afghanistan. Thank you to the congregation for supporting our efforts-to-date to help them; the couple is eternally grateful. #### Call for Volunteers: Hickory Street Community Lunch

On Saturday, September 24th we will again prepare and serve a free lunch for the community at Hickory Street Presbyterian Church, accompanied by distribution of bags of groceries. This monthly program continues to fill a real



need in that community, with requests for 120+ meals and 25-30 bags of food. Volunteers will be needed for the following tasks, many which can be pursued with children as a family activity.

#### Prepare the Main Dish (need 12 volunteers)

We will be making the Chicken/Broccoli Casserole recipe we used last August. We will supply the spice packet and the aluminum baking pan. Bake in advance and bring to the church the day before.

#### Make a Dessert (need 12 volunteers)

Prepare a dessert (to serve 10-12 people) of your own choosing that is easy to serve or package for to-go meals. Cookies, brownies, sheet cakes are all good ideas. Make in advance and bring to the church the day before.

#### Serve the Meal (need 10 volunteers)

Greet guests and seat them or take their take-out order, package desserts, heat and serve/package the hot meals, fill grocery bags, clean-up. Start at 9:00 am and finish at 1:00 pm at Hickory Street Presbyterian.

### Purchase Groceries for Food Bags (need 25-30 bags)


Purchase and bring to the Narthex items on the "shopping list;" copies in the Narthex. Grab a list early and you can watch for sales!

# Mission and Justice

During September, a **Season of Peace** (designed by the national Presbyterian Church) will be observed for four weeks from Sunday A Season of September 4th until World Communion Sunday on October 2nd. This month long pilgrimage is designed to deepen the pursuit of peace for congregations, small groups, families, and individuals.



Participants are invited to define and deepen their calling as peacemakers through daily reflections that address some of the major issues of our time (climate change, nonviolence, the intersection of poverty and racism, and immigration/migration).

To receive these daily reflections in your email during Season of Peace, subscribe at pcusa.org/subscribeSOP.

Also, be on the lookout for Peace Cards that will be in the Narthex and on tables during coffee hour (they offer a question for reflection, an action to be taken and a prayer to be spoken).

During this Season of Peace, we will be collecting our Peace and Global Witness Special Offering. A gift to this offering enables the church to promote the Peace of Christ by addressing systems of conflict and injustice across the world. 50% of this offering will be used by the Presbyterian Mission Agency to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of violence, including our own, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness. 25% will be used by mid councils for ministries of peace and reconciliation. The final 25% is designated for local congregations to continue with peacemaking efforts of their choice. This year, we will be donating our 25% congregational portion to the village of Gwo Jan, Haiti, with our friend YaYa as the disperser of the funds to aid the villagers facing the most severe sustenance, shelter, and security needs.

We have received reports from our former church member and friend Dave Porter that the village of Gwo Jan, much like most of Haiti, is in dire straits with gangs threatening with robbery and kidnapping, causing a need for hiding and a loss of income. So, our wish with our 25% donation to YaYa's village will be to provide help with the survival, safety, and sustenance needs of the villagers. Please take a look at the photo display in the Narthex of the Choukoun (place of meaningful encounter) in this village, that serves for village conferences and educational classes for visitors to Haiti. We helped in the funding of this Choukoun's construction, and you will see how we and other contributors were honored in the construction with hearts.

Please consider giving generously as we promote peacemaking through our offering. You can make your donations on line via our church's website (follow the "Give Here" green button and designate your gift to this offering), send the church a check through the mail noting the offering on your check, or using the special offering envelope found in the pews at church or in your box of weekly offerings envelopes.
