We're here to care for FPC members and friends and we count on all of you to let us know when help is needed. This is our ministry and our Christian privilege to care for you.

From the Pastor November 2022

Years ago, when I was exploring if I wanted to apply to become your pastor, I called the Rev. Connie Steinbrenner, who served as the presbytery executive for this region. I asked, "What could you tell me about the Clarks Summit church?" Connie thought for a minute, then said, "The Clarks Summit church can do whatever it wants to do. It simply needs to decide on what that is."

He was exactly right. This remarkable congregation is full of positive energy. Whenever we have seen a need - and agreed on its importance - the need has been met. I've seen it again and again. This is a time when many churches are struggling – and the Church on the Hill continues to inspire me with its commitment and generosity.

The pandemic disrupted our momentum, yet our sanctuary is refilling. The choir loft was empty, but now the seats are repopulated. We have lost a generation of good souls, yet as is often the case, others are stepping up to provide leadership. Most inspiring has been your financial support, especially over three demanding years and two very good years.

Financially, here is how we have done with pledges over the past five years:

2021 Goal was 325,000. 330,341 received (**5,341** above the goal) 2020 Goal was 325,000. 321,537 received (**3,463** below the goal) 2019 Goal was 325,000. 324,303 received (**697** below the goal) 2018 Goal was 320,000. 321,869 received (**1,869** over the goal) 2017 Goal was 320,000. 327,199 received (**7,199** over the goal)

Clearly, we've met our goals – or come within one percent of reaching them. That's remarkable! However – and you probably expected a "however" – the totals of our pledges have stayed relatively flat over five years while our expenses have increased. We are grateful that we had reserve funds which could fill the gaps. But now it's time to challenge one another to step up and move ahead. Especially in a year of eight percent inflation and some necessary capital expenses!

To keep our church strong, we are **asking you to consider a ten percent increase in your pledge for 2023.** I have already increased my regular electronic pledge by that amount, and I challenge you to join me. We haven't given you a good challenge in recent years. Now it's time. And I know you can help.

Also, as you are able, we **invite you to make an additional pledge to replenish our reserve funds**. It could be a pledge over three years, an outright gift from accumulated assets, or a commitment to our growing church endowment. Together we want our church to flourish as we reach out with the love of Jesus Christ. Watch for the pledge card that will arrive shortly in the mail.

Our Stewardship Dedication Day is Sunday, November 20, when we bring our commitments to God in worship. It will be a gala service, as we welcome our confirmation class to the membership and celebrate Christ our King. We will praise our generous God, give thanks for our calling as Christ's disciples, and offer ourselves to God's holy purposes.

Thank you for all that you bring to the Lord and his work. It makes a difference. Rev. Bill

8:00 p.m. The **Bell Choir** will rehearse weekly in Fellowship Hall


Other Opportunities for Learning


Book for November Run, Rose, Run: A Novel By Dolly Parton and James Patterson


